

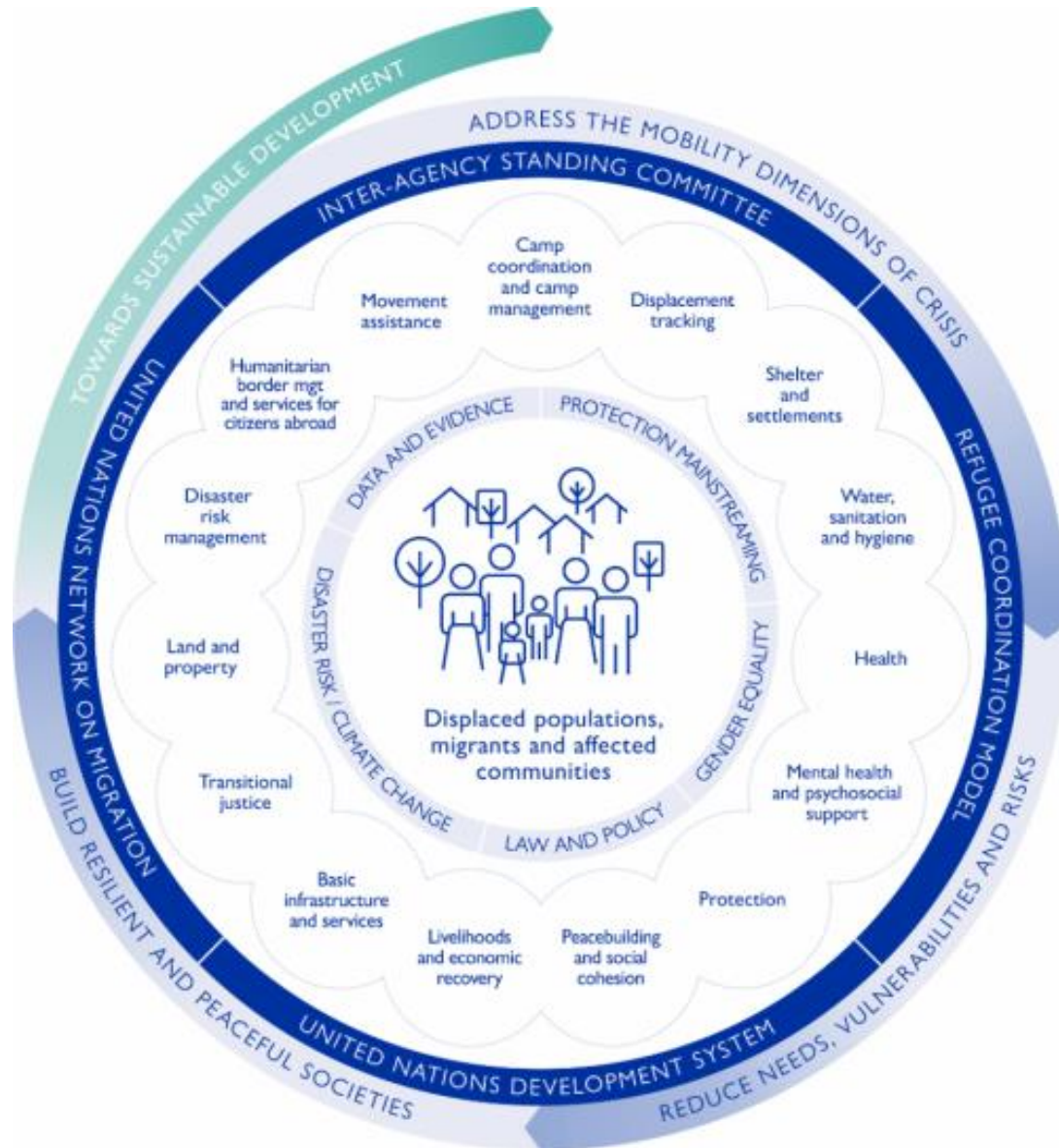

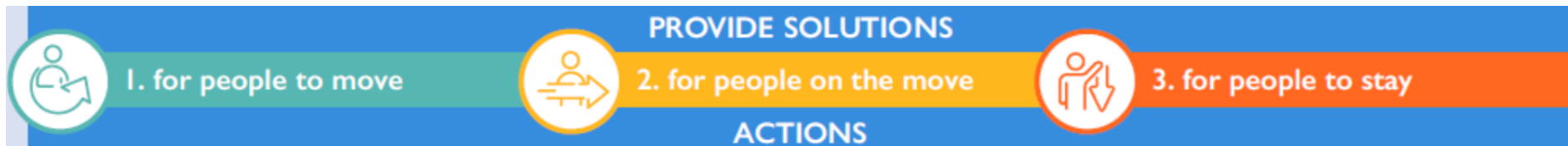

The Migration Crisis Operational Framework (MCOF)

- IOM's central reference point for comprehensive, inclusive and holistic responses to the mobility dimensions of crisis.
- Welcomed by IOM Council through Resolution No. 1243 in 2012.
- **Disaster risk management** as one of key pillars of intervention to strengthen resilience and reduce disaster losses in alignment with the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015–2030.

We develop solutions for people to stay

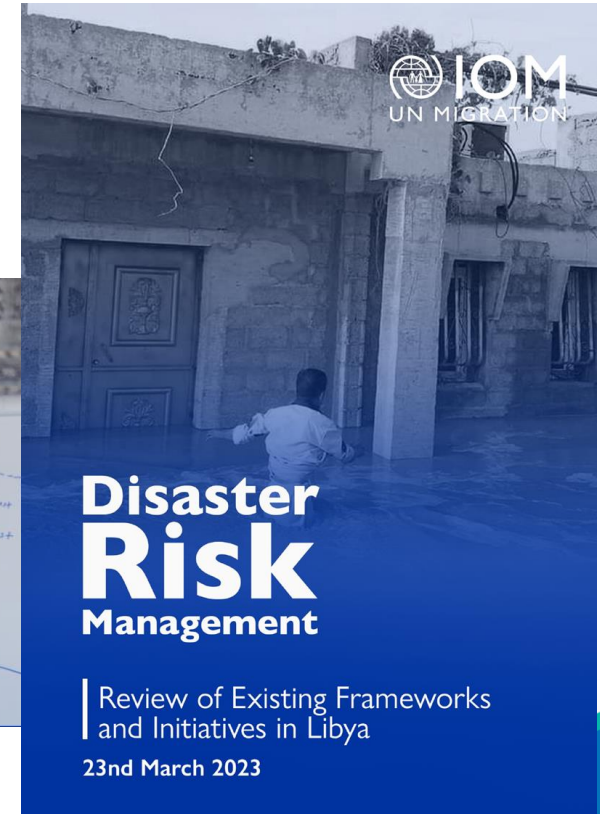
Making migration a choice by building resilience and addressing the adverse drivers – *through disaster risk reduction and adaptation action*

Project example: Enhancing Disaster Risk Management Capacity in Libya

Objective: to contribute to strengthened preparedness and response capacities of local authorities and resilience of disaster-affected and at-risk communities.

Key activities

- Support knowledge production and work on capacity building of key stakeholders for an informed design of DRM frameworks at the local level.
- Communities exposed to disaster risks demonstrate increased resilience and capacity to prepare for and respond to disasters.



Programme in the pipeline: Harnessing synergies between Climate Change Adaptation and Risk Reduction in Migrant-Inclusive Health System Responses (Jordan, Iraq and Lebanon)



- The joint programme to be implemented through funding from the Migration MPTF.
- Objectives:
 - Improve the evidence base of the intersections between climate change, risk reduction, health and well-being, and human mobility.
 - Support the countries to integrate a human mobility lens into national public health adaptation strategies and DRR strategies.
 - Enhance understanding of health impacts of climate change among the host and migrant communities in the target countries.
