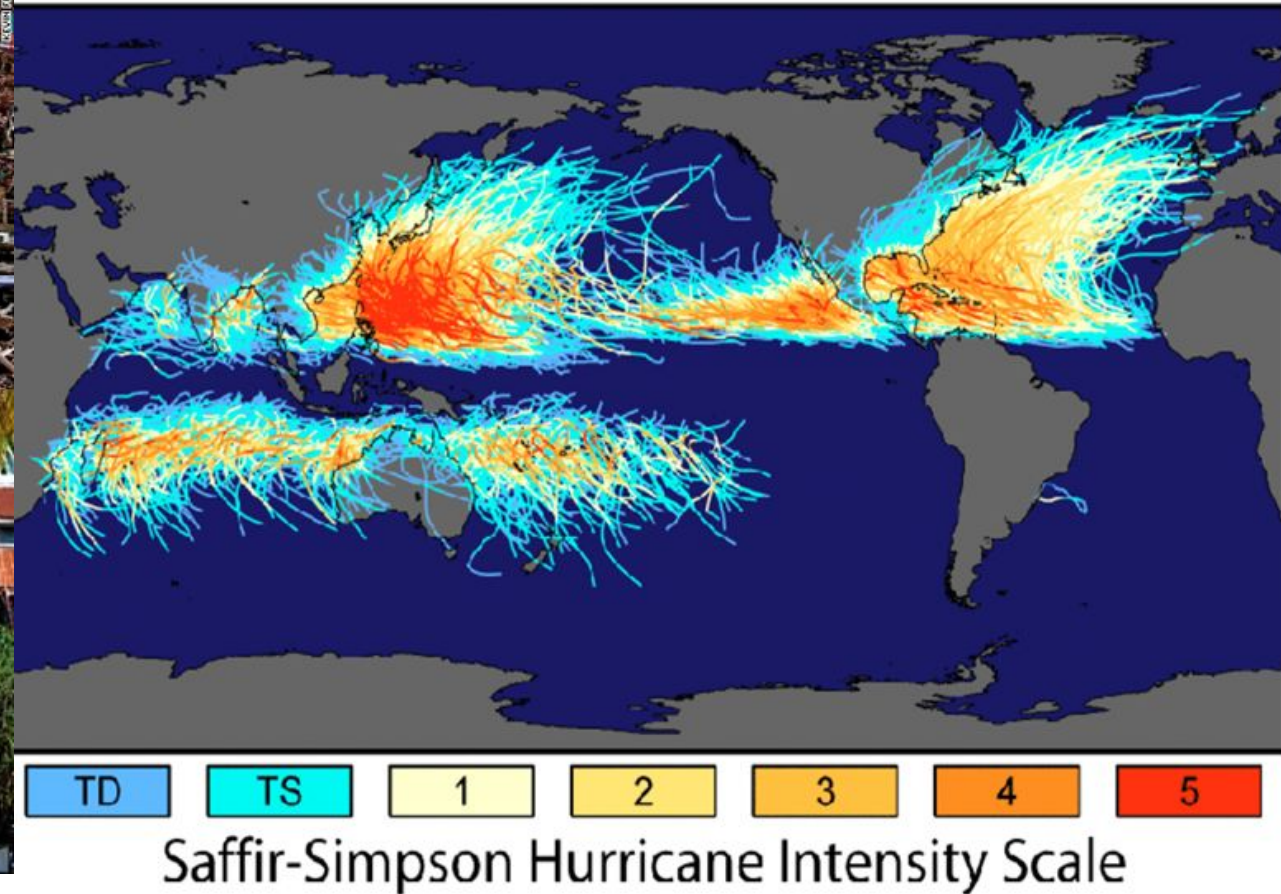

AN ACT STRENGTHENING THE PHILIPPINE DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM, PROVIDING FOR THE NATIONAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT FRAMEWORK AND INSTITUTIONALIZING THE NATIONAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT PLAN, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

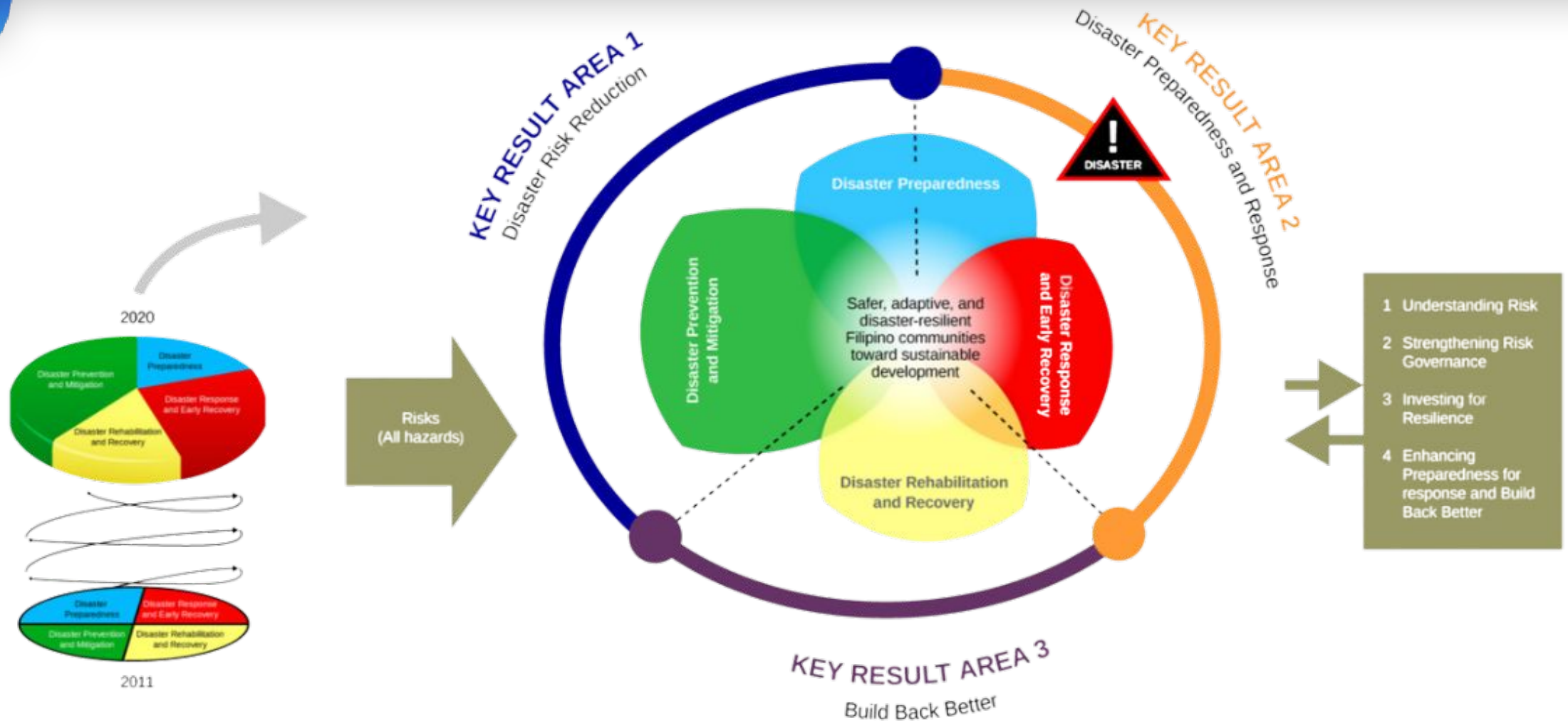
*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

SECTION 1. *Title.* - This Act shall be known as the
"Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of
2010".

An Act strengthening the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management System, providing for the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Framework, and institutionalizing the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan, appropriating funds thereof and for other purposes.



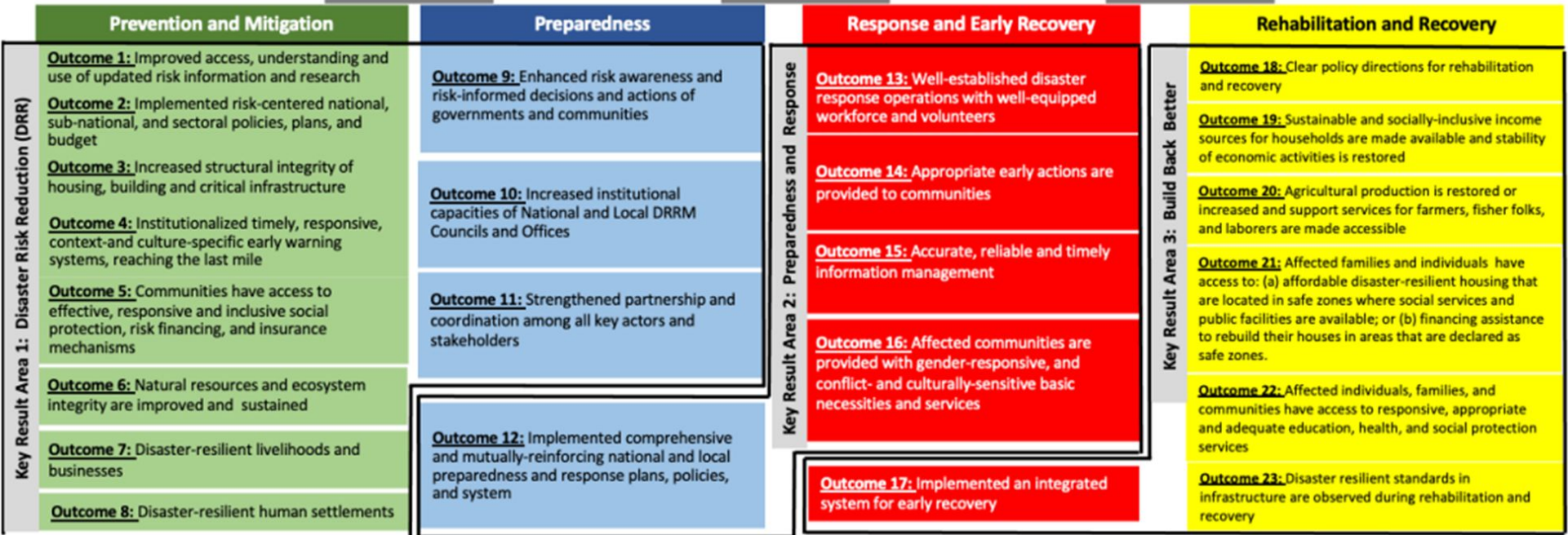

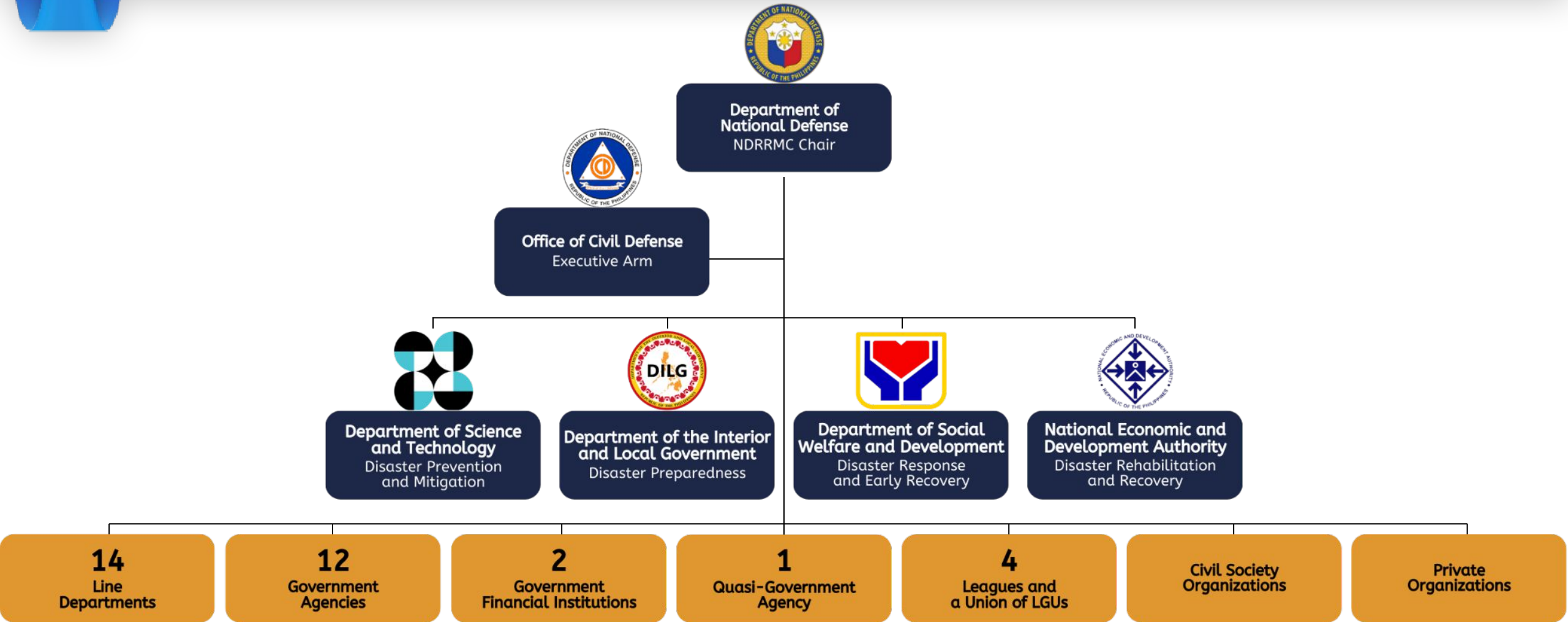

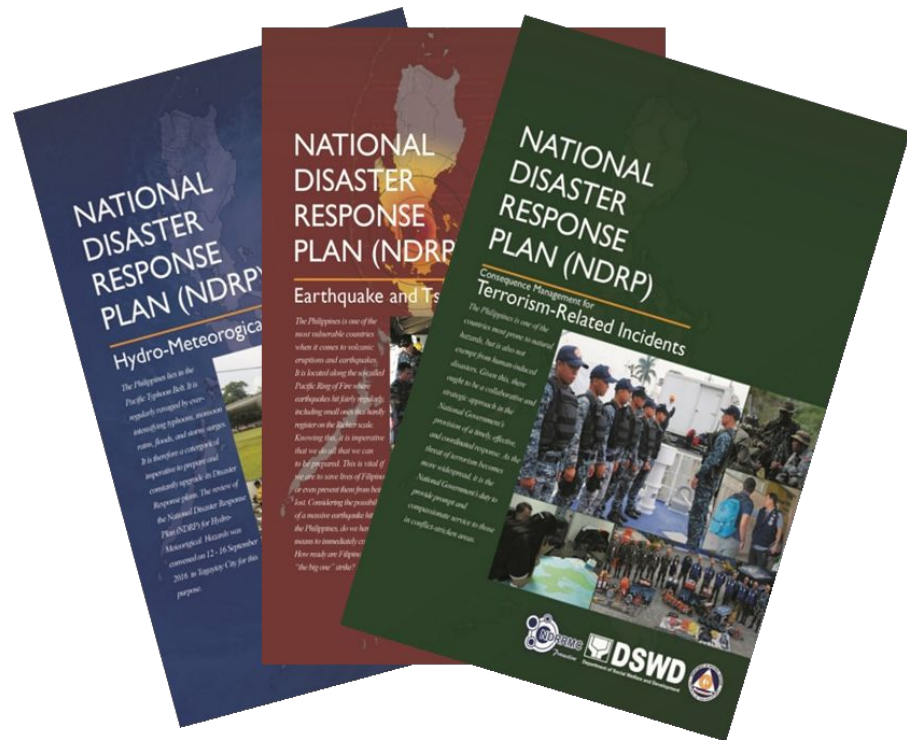

NATIONAL DISASTER RESPONSE PLAN



- It is the Government of the Philippines’ “Multi-Hazard” Response Plan.
- It outlines the processes and mechanism to facilitate a coordinated response from the National down to the Local Level Agencies.
- **The NDRP adopts the Rule of Two and Cluster Approach.**

Provincial DRRMC	2 or more Cities/Municipalities affected
Regional DRRMC	2 or more Provinces affected
National DRRMC	2 or more Regions affected

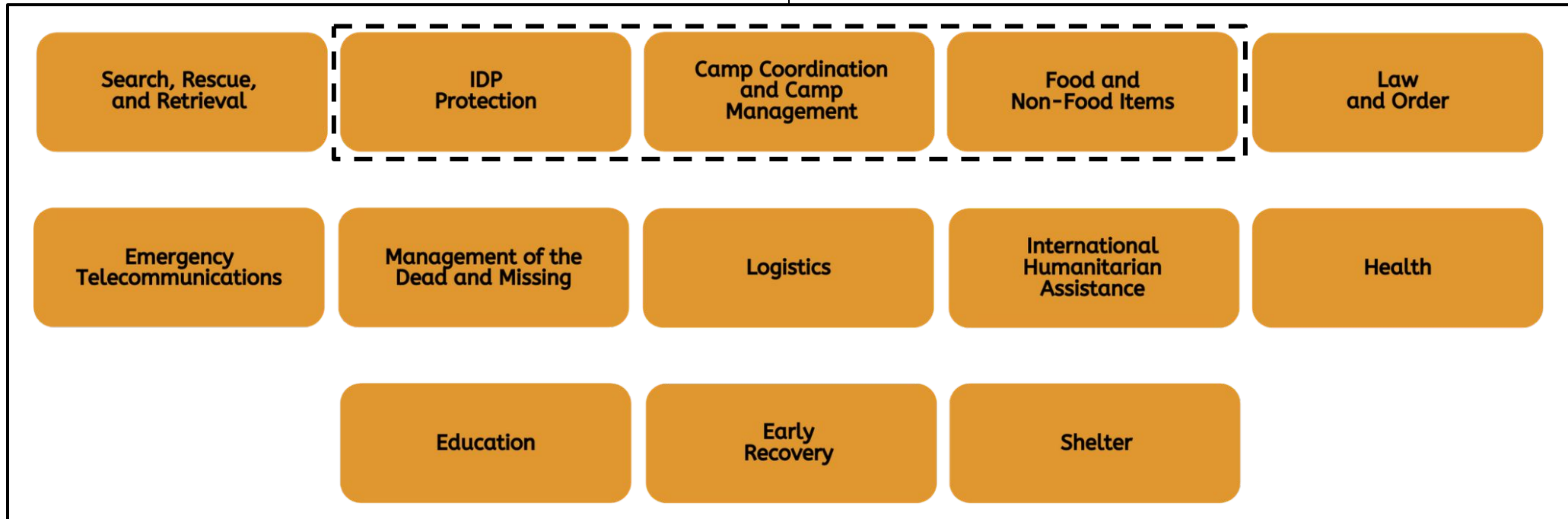
For **augmentation** to the operations of the affected LGUs.

COMPONENTS



Modified Shelter Assistance Project (MSAP)

- Memorandum Circular No. 08 series of 2023 also known as Comprehensive Guidelines on the DSWD's Implementation of the PAMANA Program
- Provision of shelter materials for the construction of modified shelter projects through the Neighborhood Association on Shelter Assistance (NASA)



Cash-for-Work Program

- Memorandum Circular No. 04 series of 2021 also known as the Enhanced Guidelines for the Implementation of Cash/Food for Work/Training/Caring;
- Provide additional income support to disaster affected families and labor component for the construction of shelters;
- Build or rehabilitate community assets; and
- Strengthen partnership and collaboration with the Local Government Units and other stakeholders.
