HOPE Foundation COVID response summary

- Opened 2 COVID units (100 beds) next to it's 2 maternity hospitals
- Arranged PPE for all the staff across it's 26 facilities
- Training for all the staff- clinical and non-clinical staff
- Collaborated with Funders, Govt. Offices, WHO, INGOs and local NGOs
- Partnered with local communities
- Used local resources- personnel, supplies, equipment


Since March, 2020 - to date

Managing Other emergencies- Storm, landslide, cyclone, heavy rain, flood, fire outbreak common in the area


- Motivated Leadership
